

Cite Your Sources

APA Style

As you gather information, images and sounds, create a Bibliography in a Word document. When you finish, copy and paste your sources in the credits.

Watch for text on the web page that says, "This may not be used without express permission." That means you cannot use it without contacting the creator.

For most images and copyright free audio, you may use them for a school project, but may not post them on the web or use them for financial gain. (Like selling a T-Shirt with the Family Guy cast.)

Always give credit to your source!!



Images

Creator's last name, first name. "Title of photo." **Photo.** **Website title** **Date published.** **Date viewed** <web address>.

examples:

Suzuki, Lea. "Mick Jagger." **Photo.** **SFGate.com** **14 Nov. 2005.** **14 Nov. 2005** <<http://www.sfgate.com>>.

"Golden Retriever." **Photo.** **My Pet Finder .com** **2009.** **01 Sept. 2009** <http://www.mypetfinder.com/dog_breeds/golden-retriever/>



Music or Sounds

Artist. "Title of Piece." **Title of album or longer work.** **Production Company,** **Date released.** **Date Accessed.** <Web address>

examples :

Jackson, Michael. **"Thriller."** **Thriller [25th Anniversary Edition].** **Epic,** **12 Dec. 2009.** 1 Sept. 2009.

Author. Book Title. Place of Publication: Publisher, Date of Publication.

Web Site



Author last name, first name middle name. "Specific Page or Title of the Article." Title of the Website. Publisher. Date of Publication. Day Month Year accessed <URL>.

Newspaper or Magazine Article



Author. "Name of the Article." Newspaper or Magazine Title Day Month. Year: Page number.
